

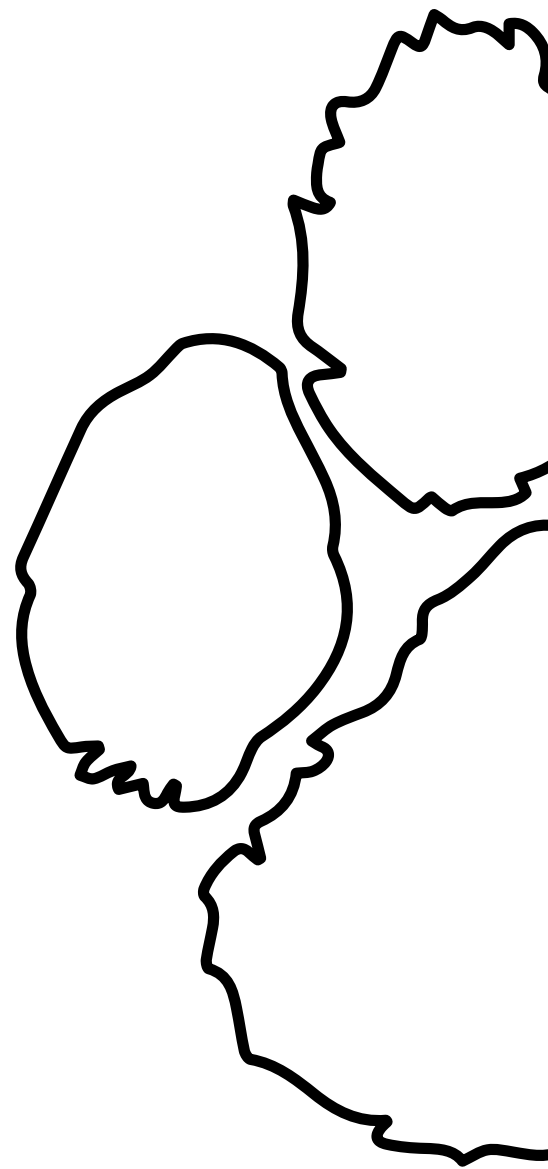

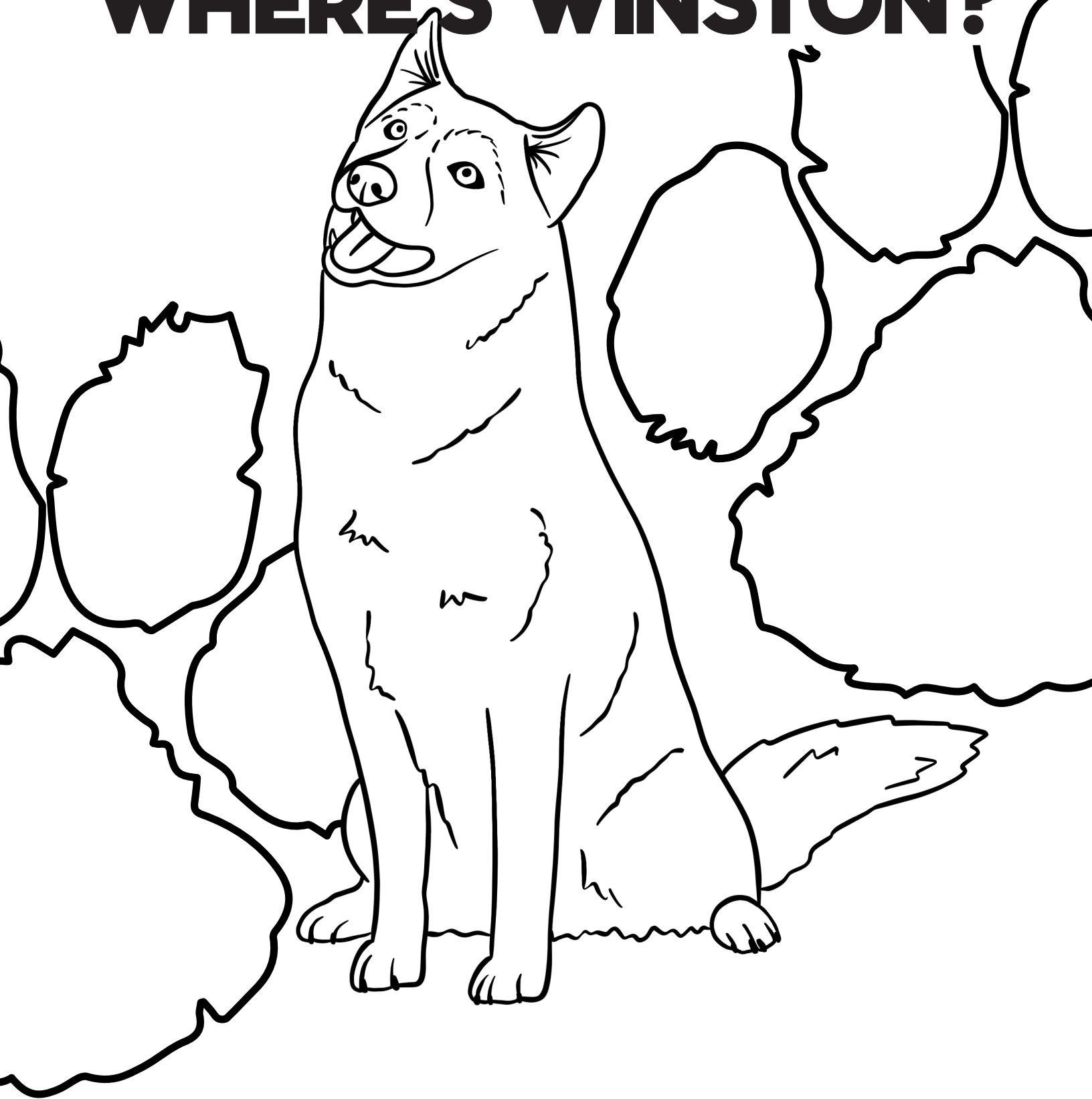

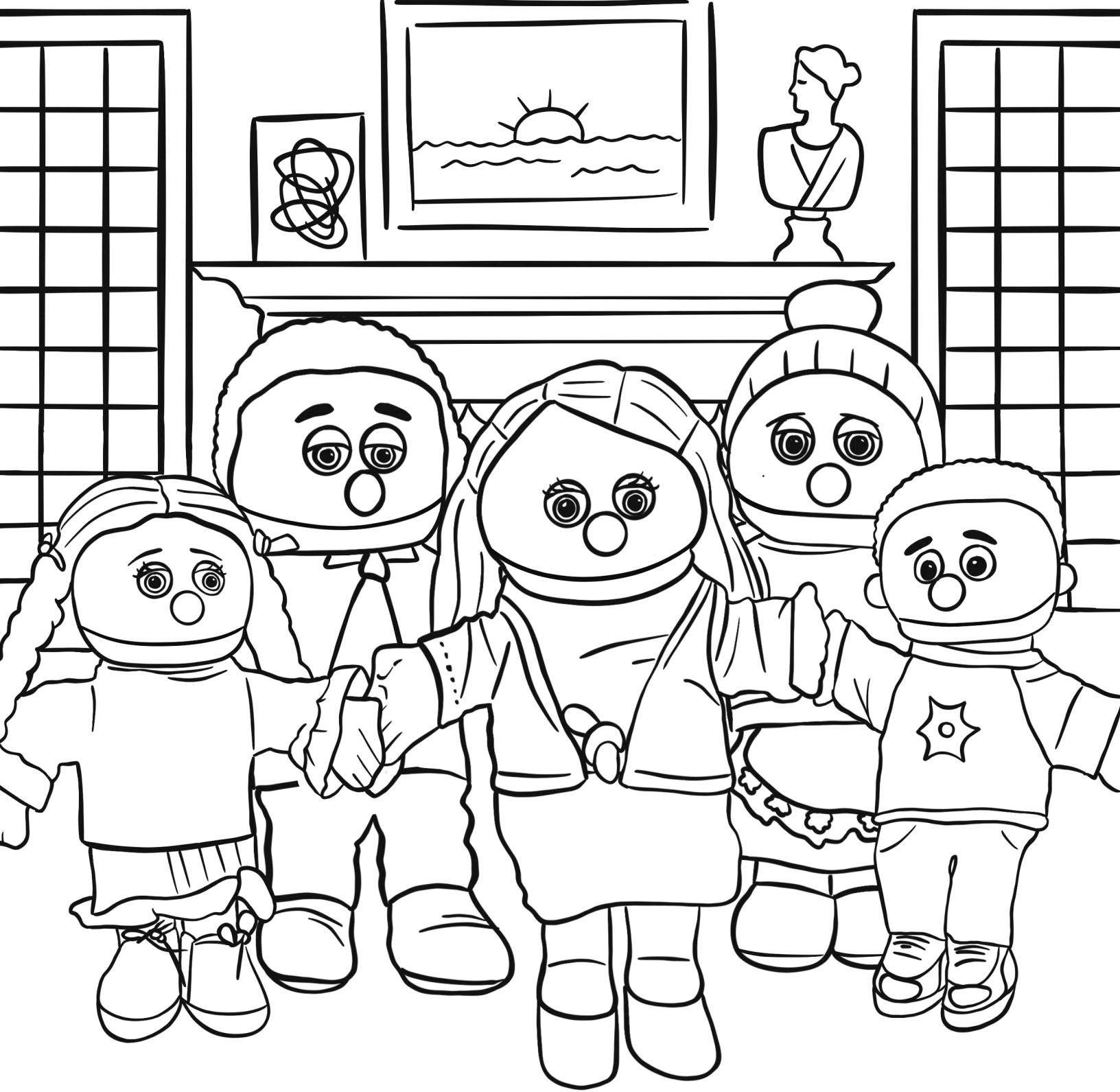

His family loves him. And Winston loves them!





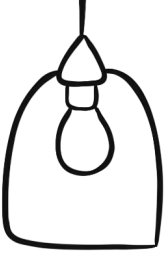
Meet Winston's family.

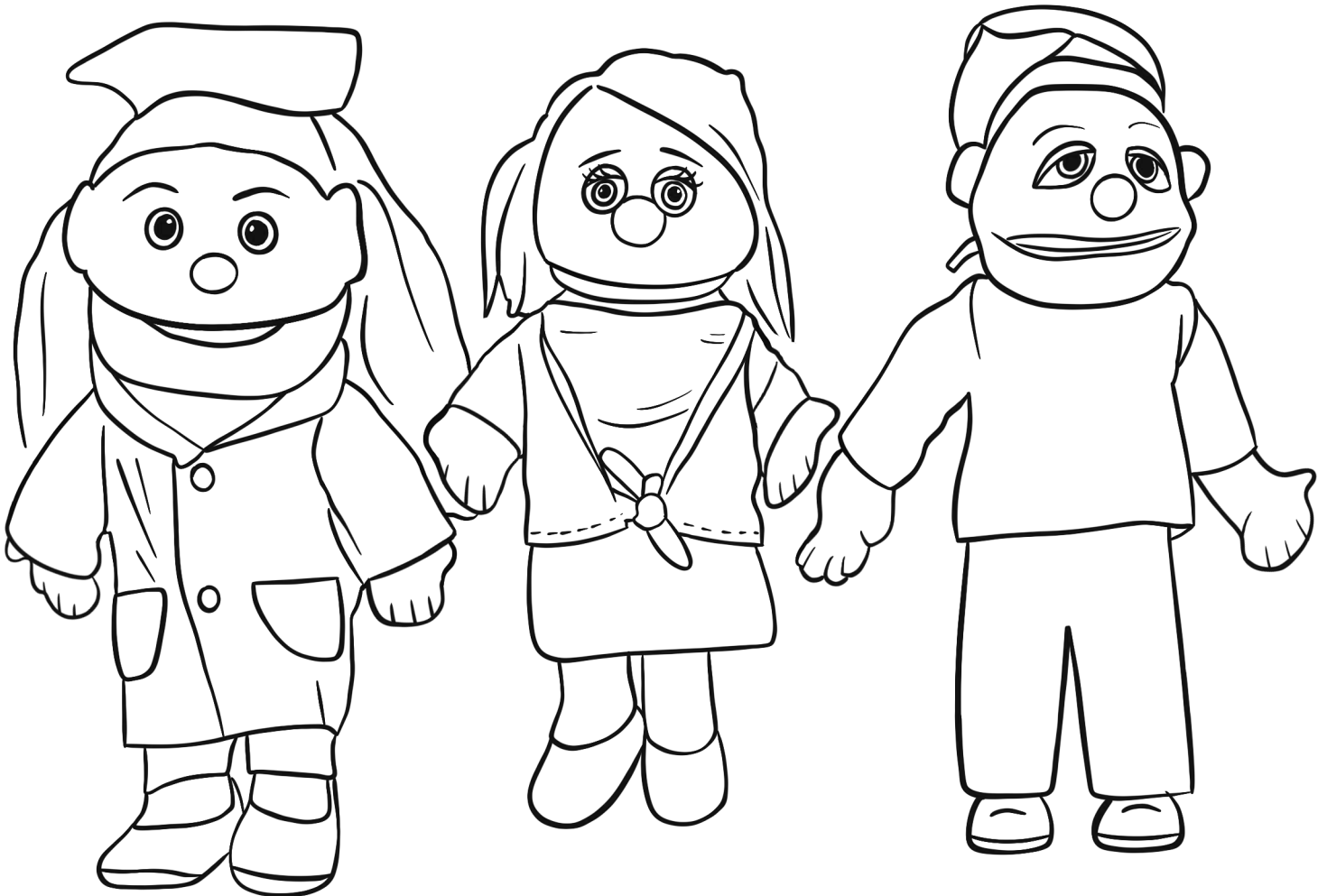
Grandma hurt her wrist when she stopped herself from falling.

- Decides on the best treatment.

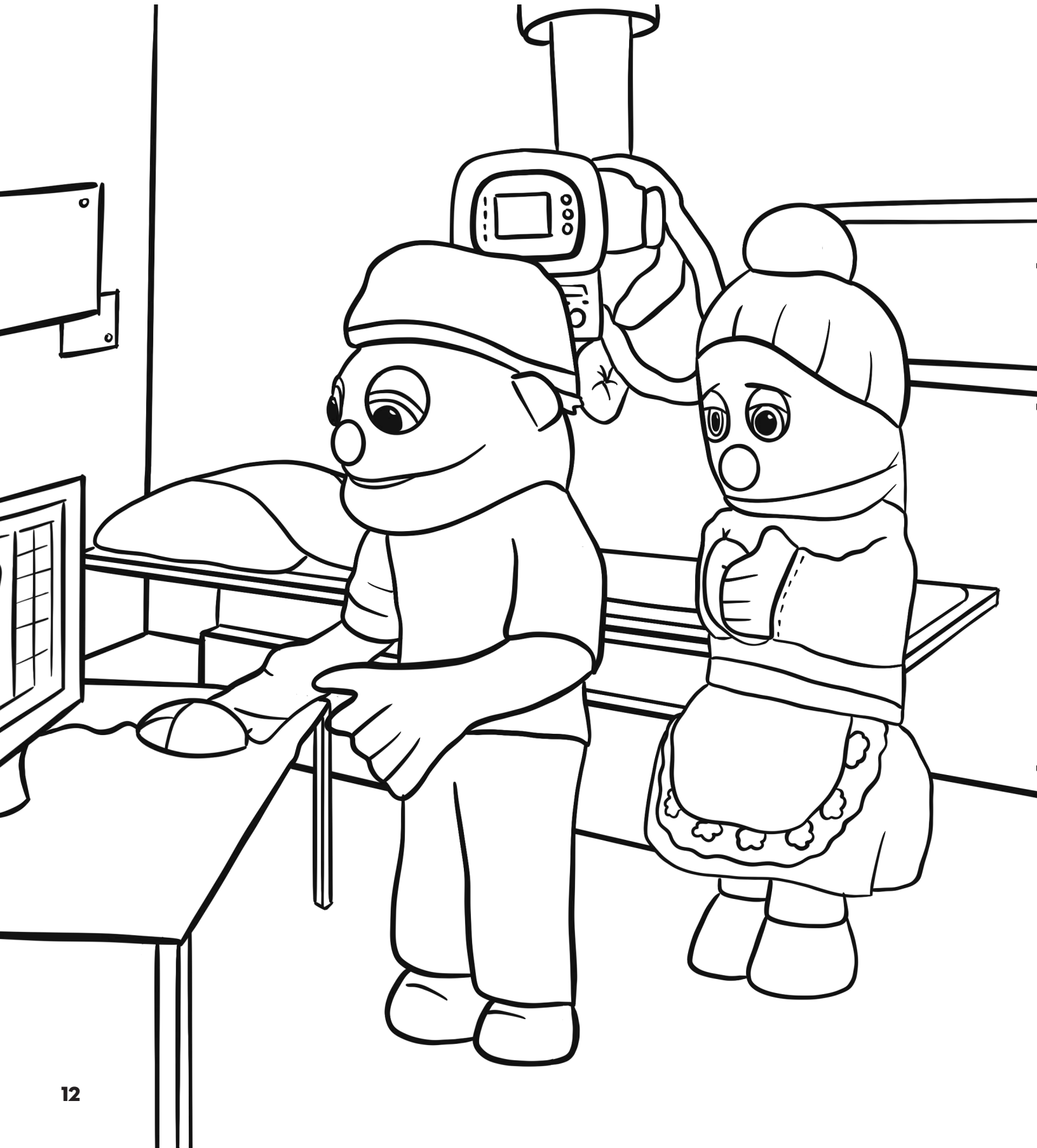
RADIOGRAPHER

At the urgent care, the nurse checks Grandma's vital signs.



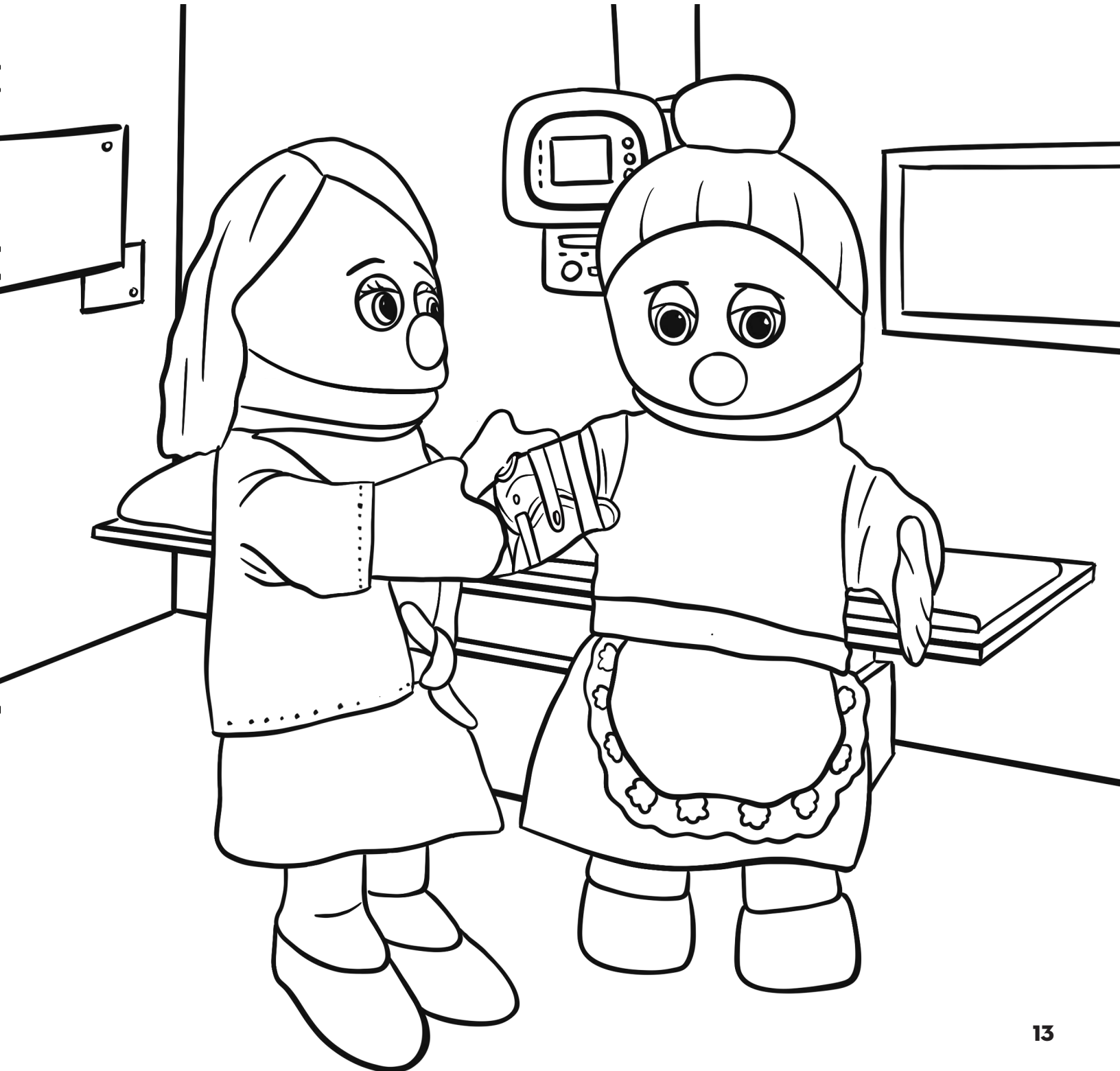
Then she gets an X-ray by the radiographer.

But Grandma may need to wear a different cast for a longer time.

a special doctor who will decide if she needs a hard cast.

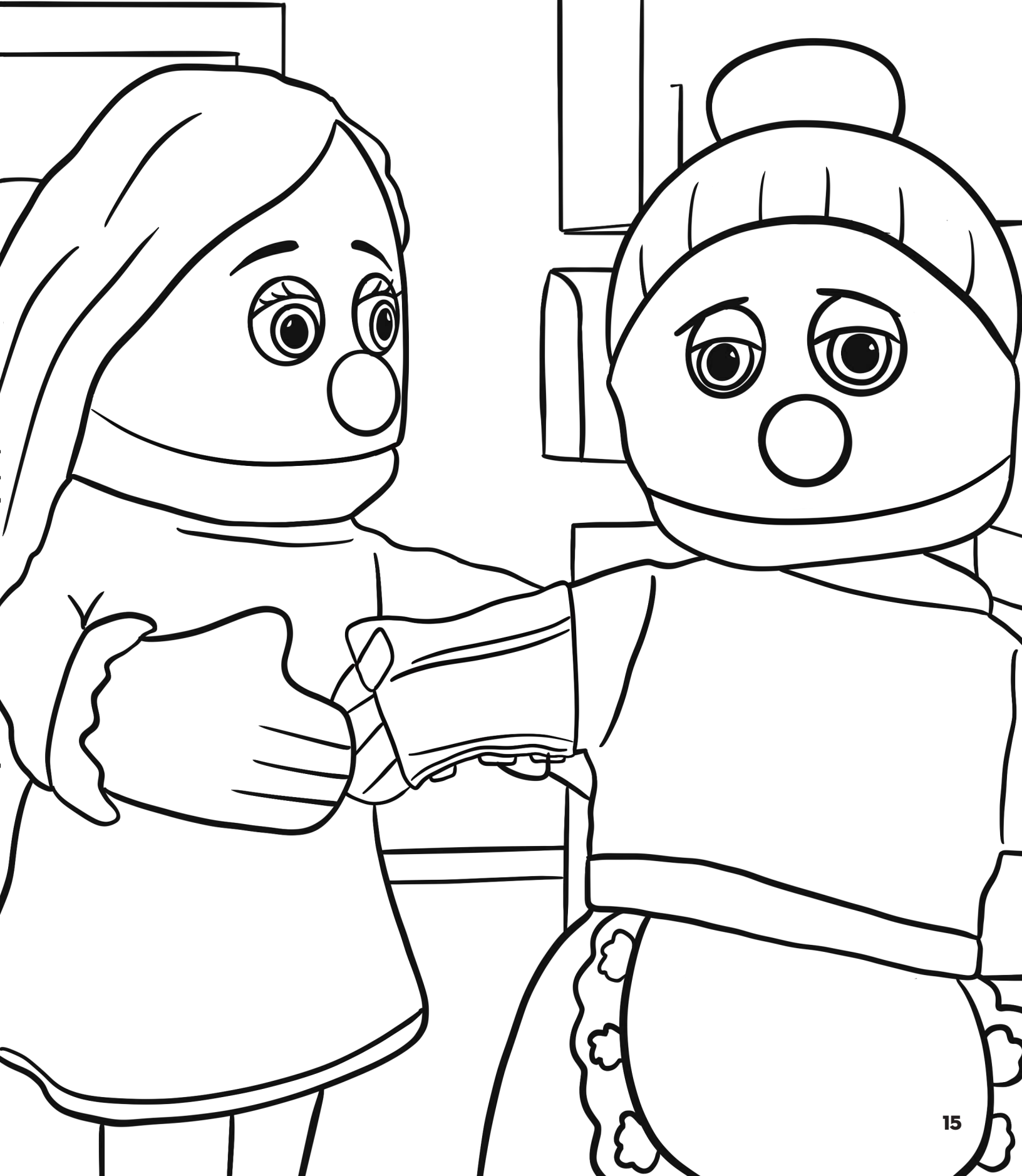
This doctor is called an orthopedic doctor.



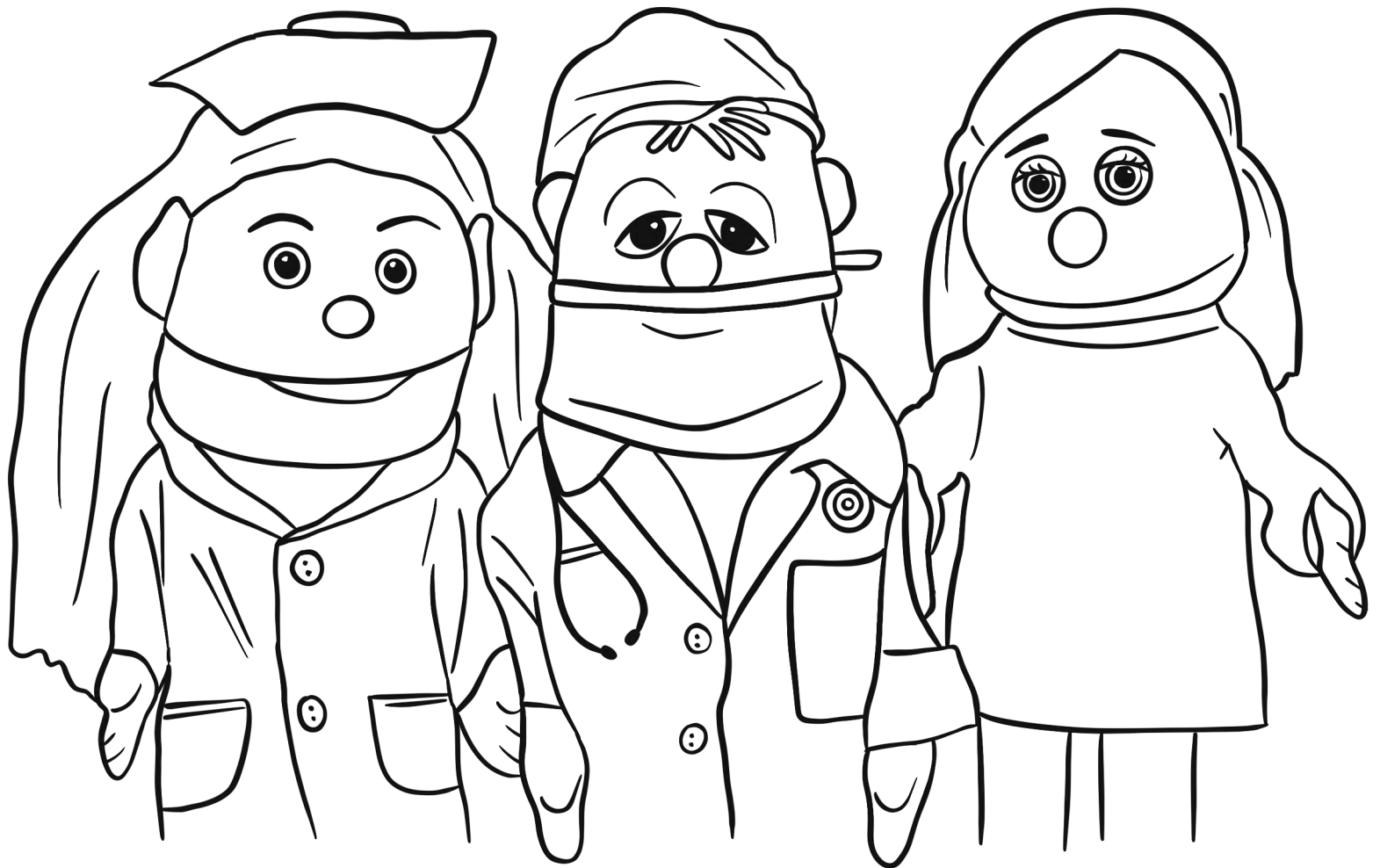


The next day, Grandma visits the orthopedic doctor.

NURSE

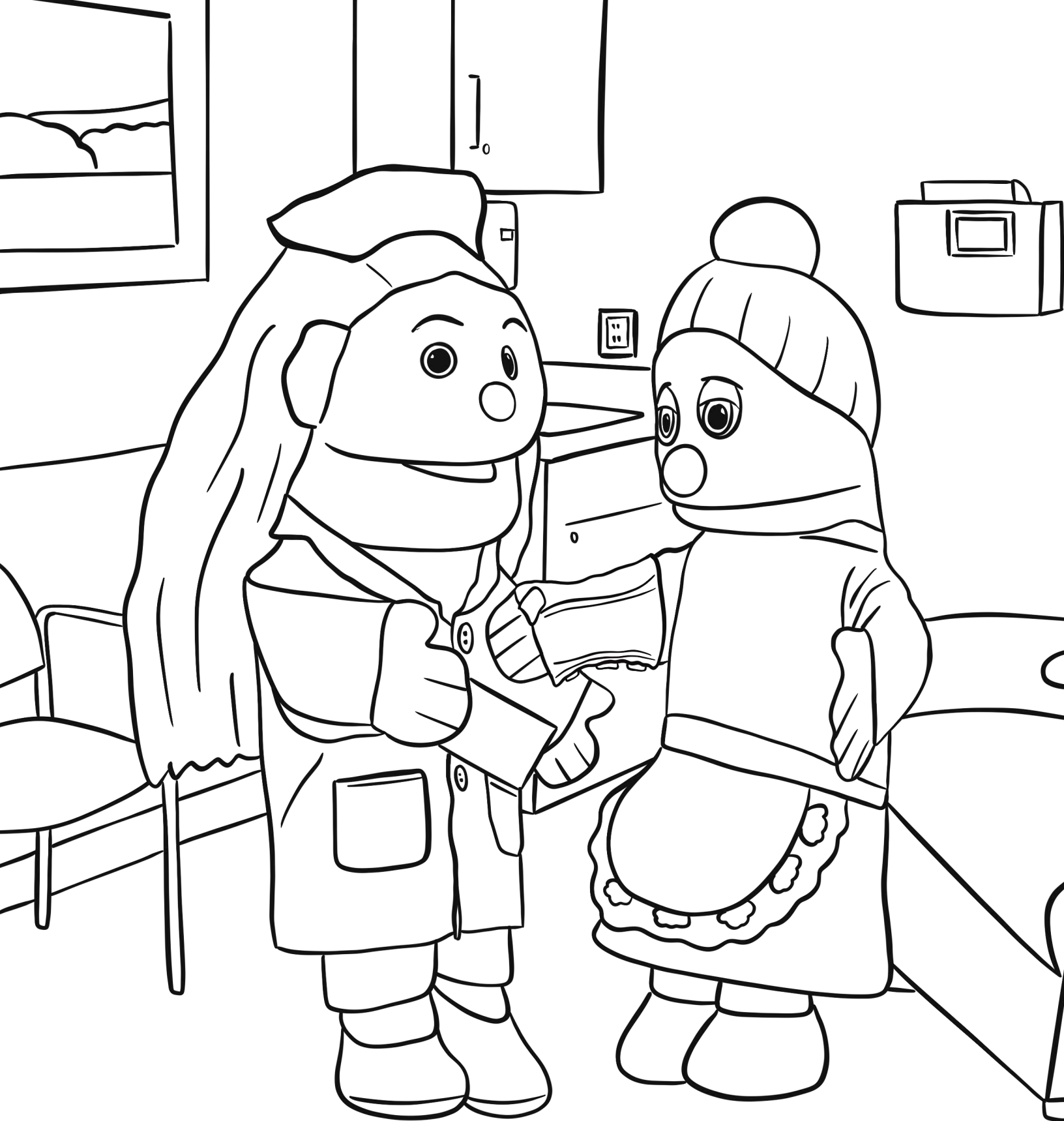
- Gives patients instructions for how to care for themselves at home.

Grandma does what the doctor says and ices her wrist at home.

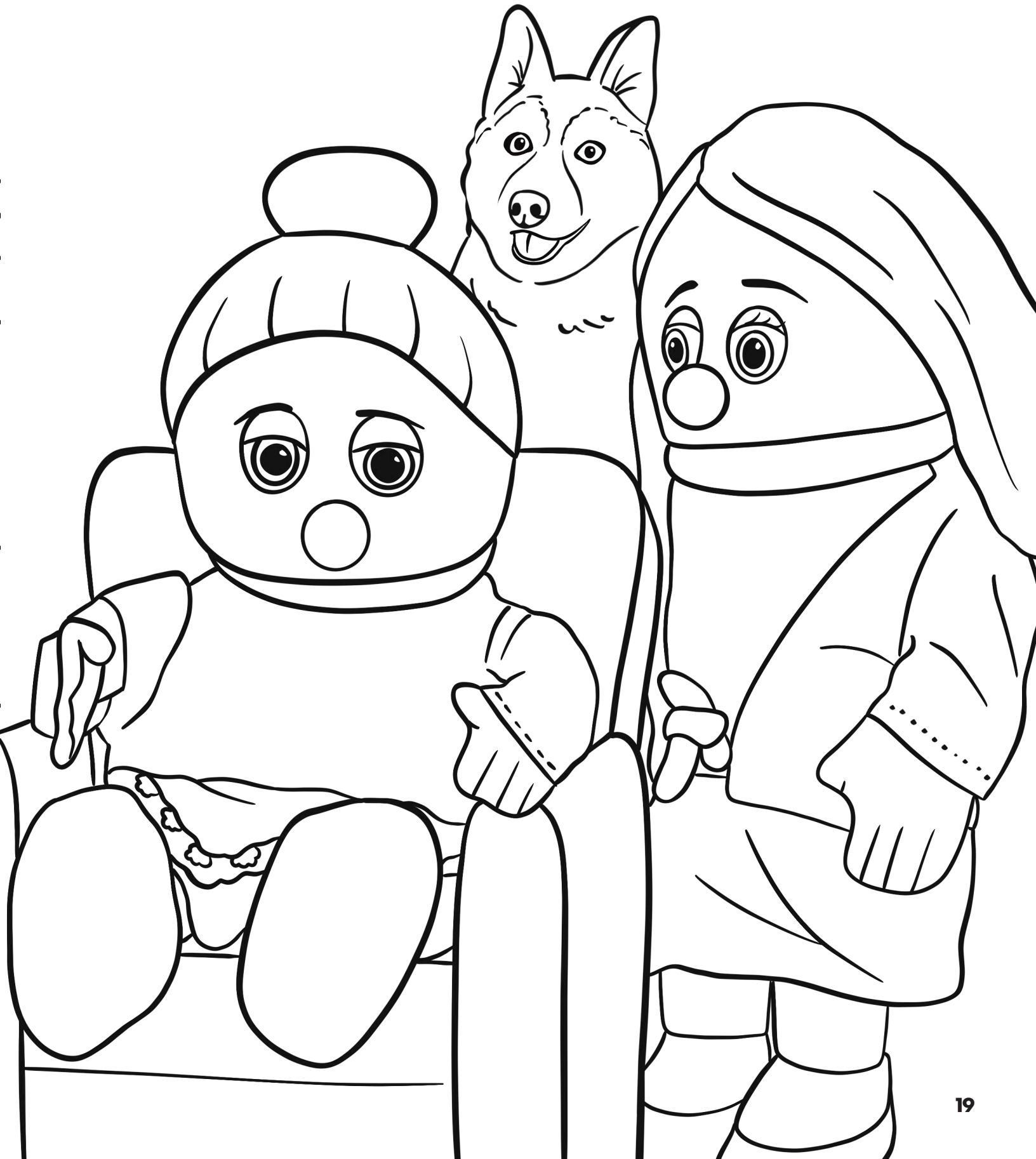
Dad says, “Grandma got a lot of help at urgent care and the orthopedic doctor’s office.”

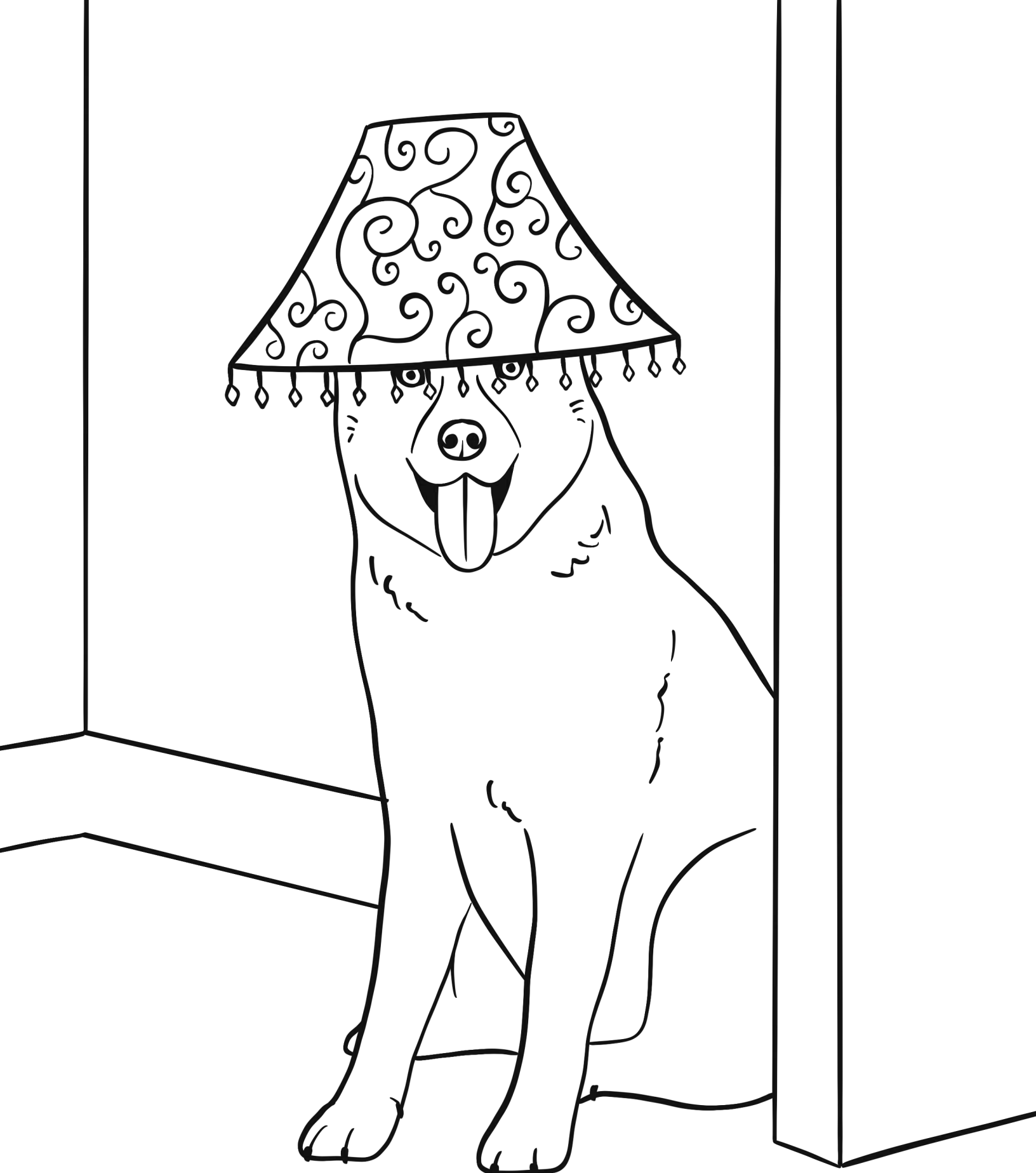
“Yes, and they gave me some souvenirs to give you kids too,” Grandma says,

Oh, no! James chases Winston and gets stung by a bee!



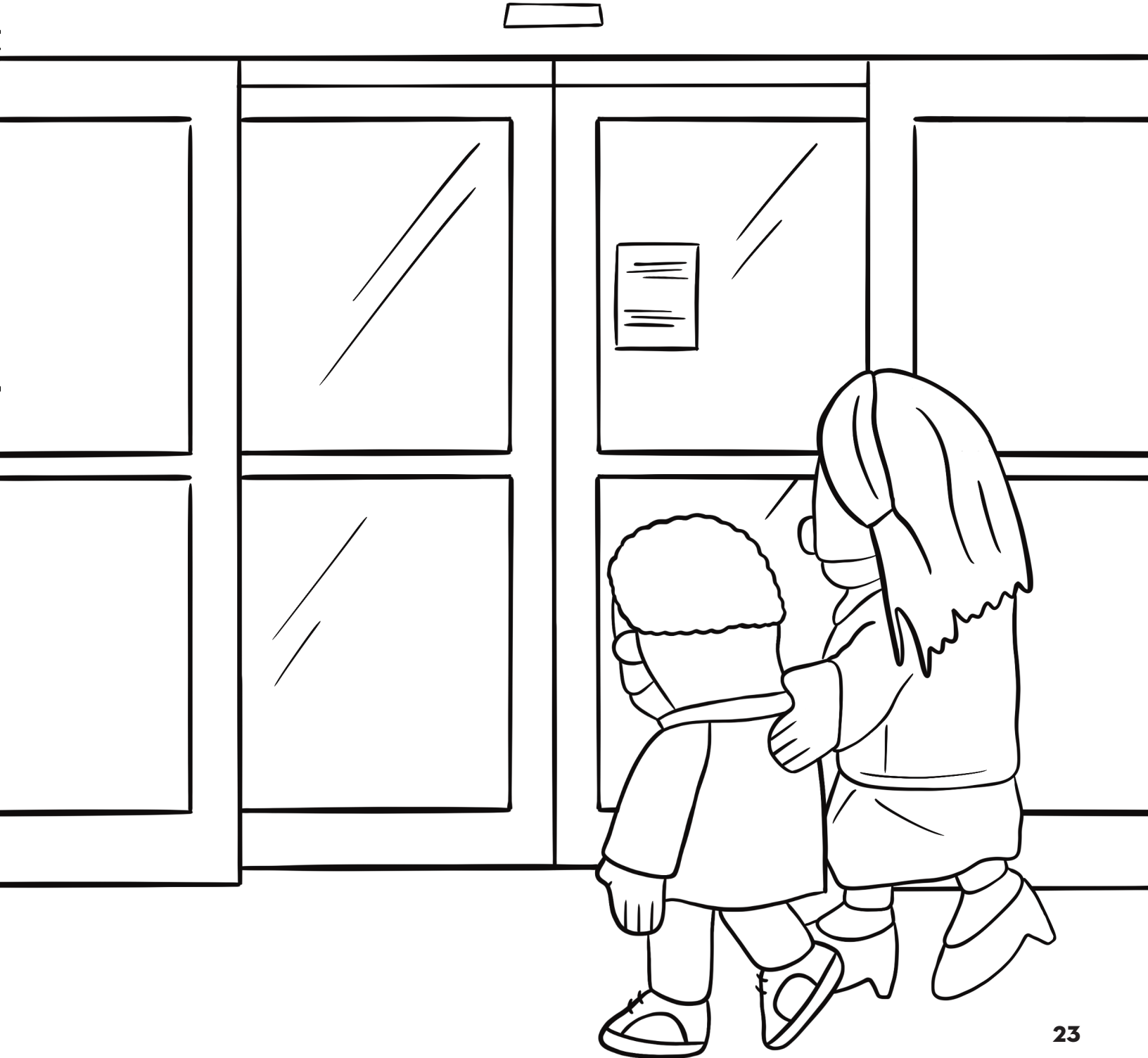


When Winston sees the front door open, watch out!

Winston always makes a run for it!

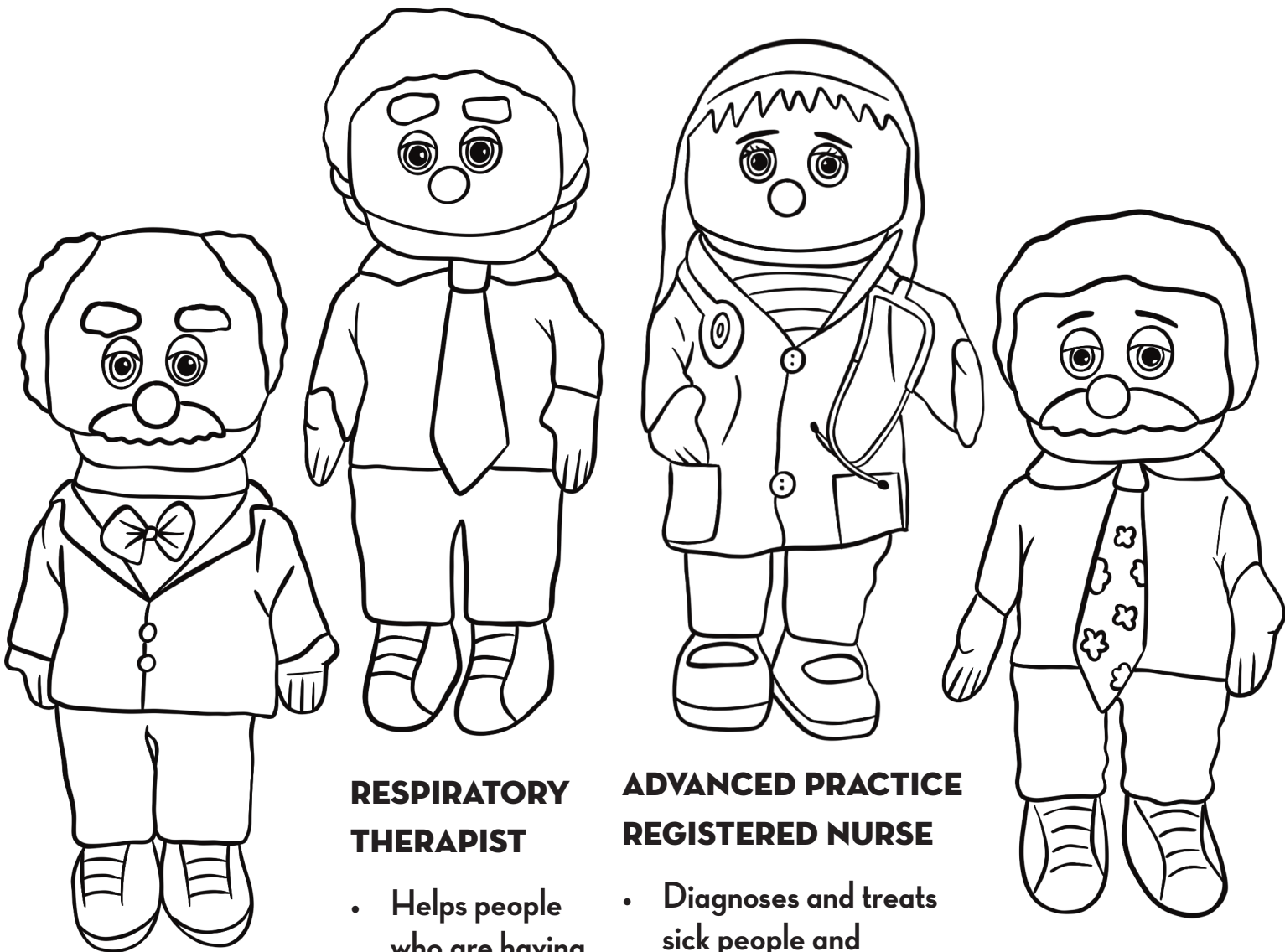
James comes through the door after school and tries to shut it tight.

- Helps people who are having trouble breathing.

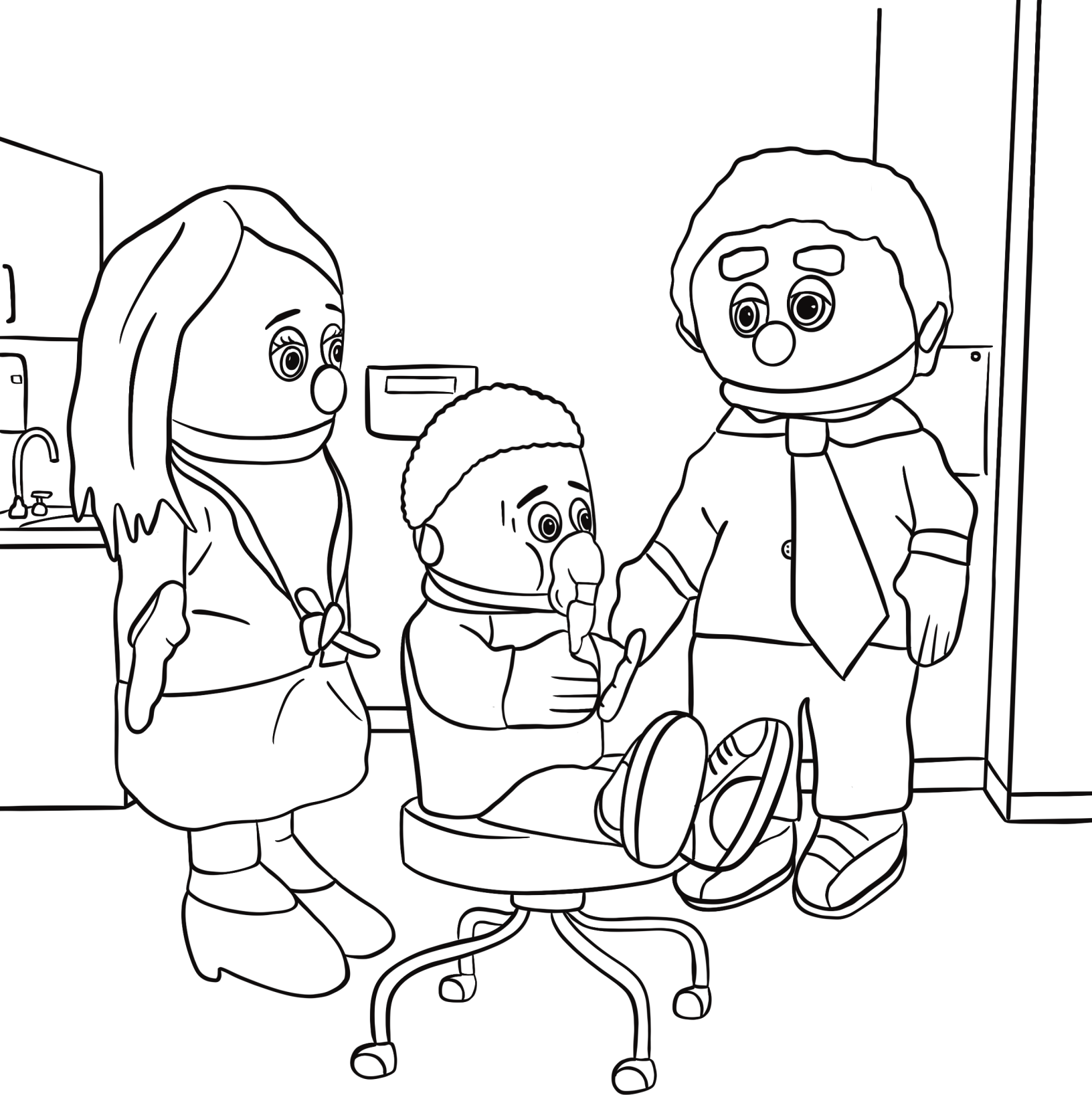
ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE

- Does some of the same kinds of things as doctors.

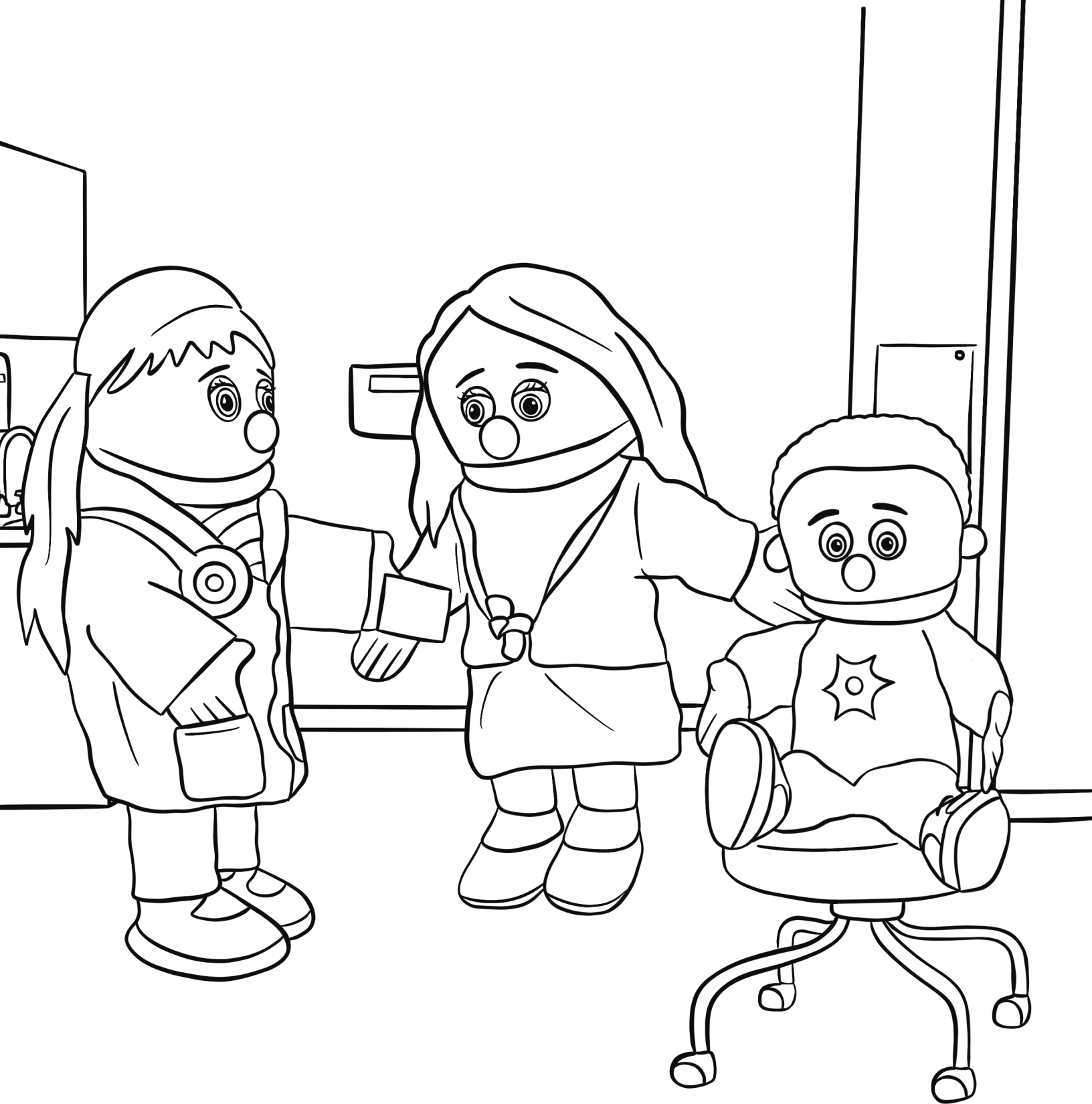
SOCIAL WORKER

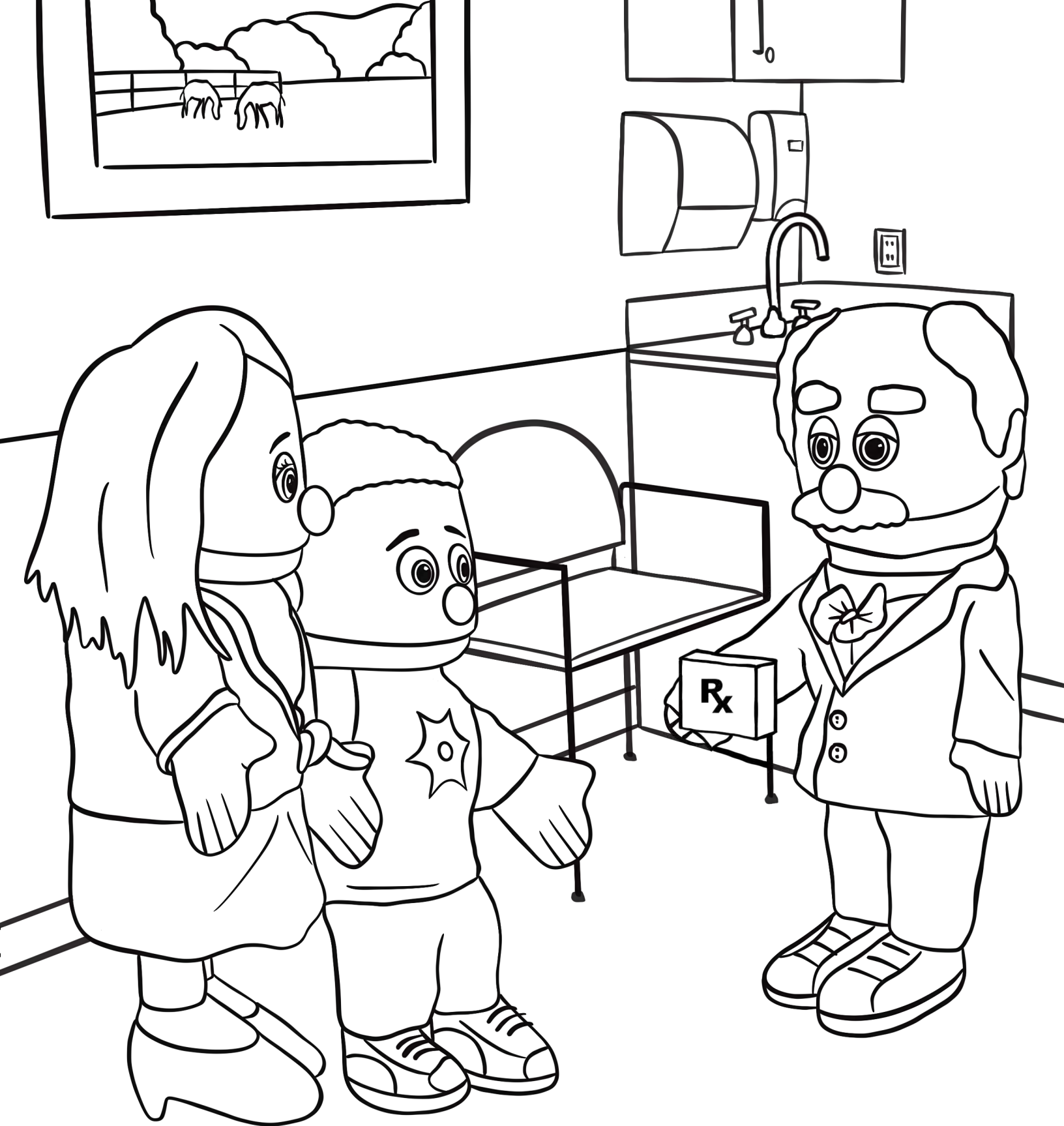
- Makes sure patients in the hospital understand what's going on and helps them feel more comfortable.

The respiratory therapist gives James a breathing treatment.

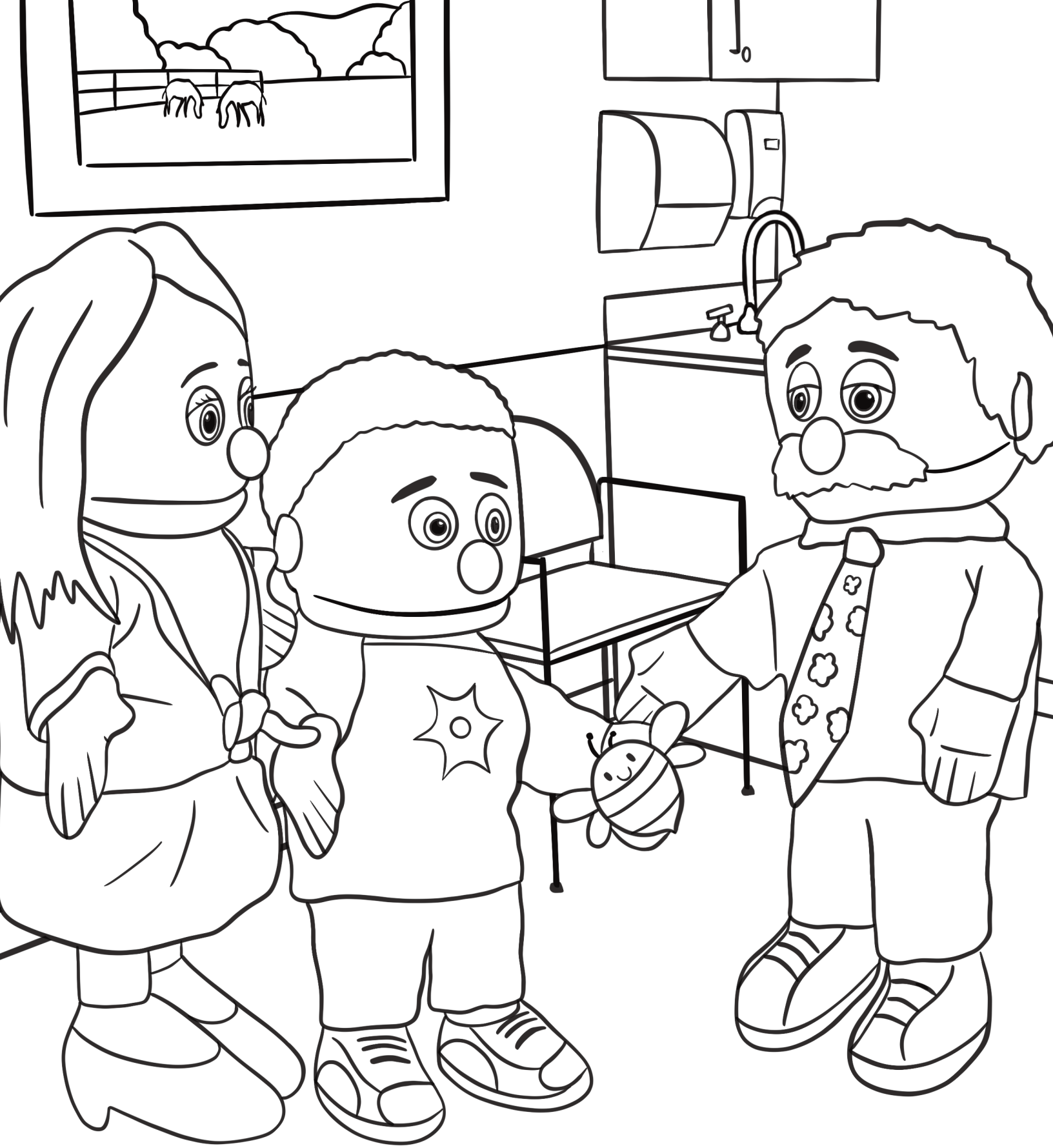


Then the advanced practice registered nurse prescribes allergy medicine for James.



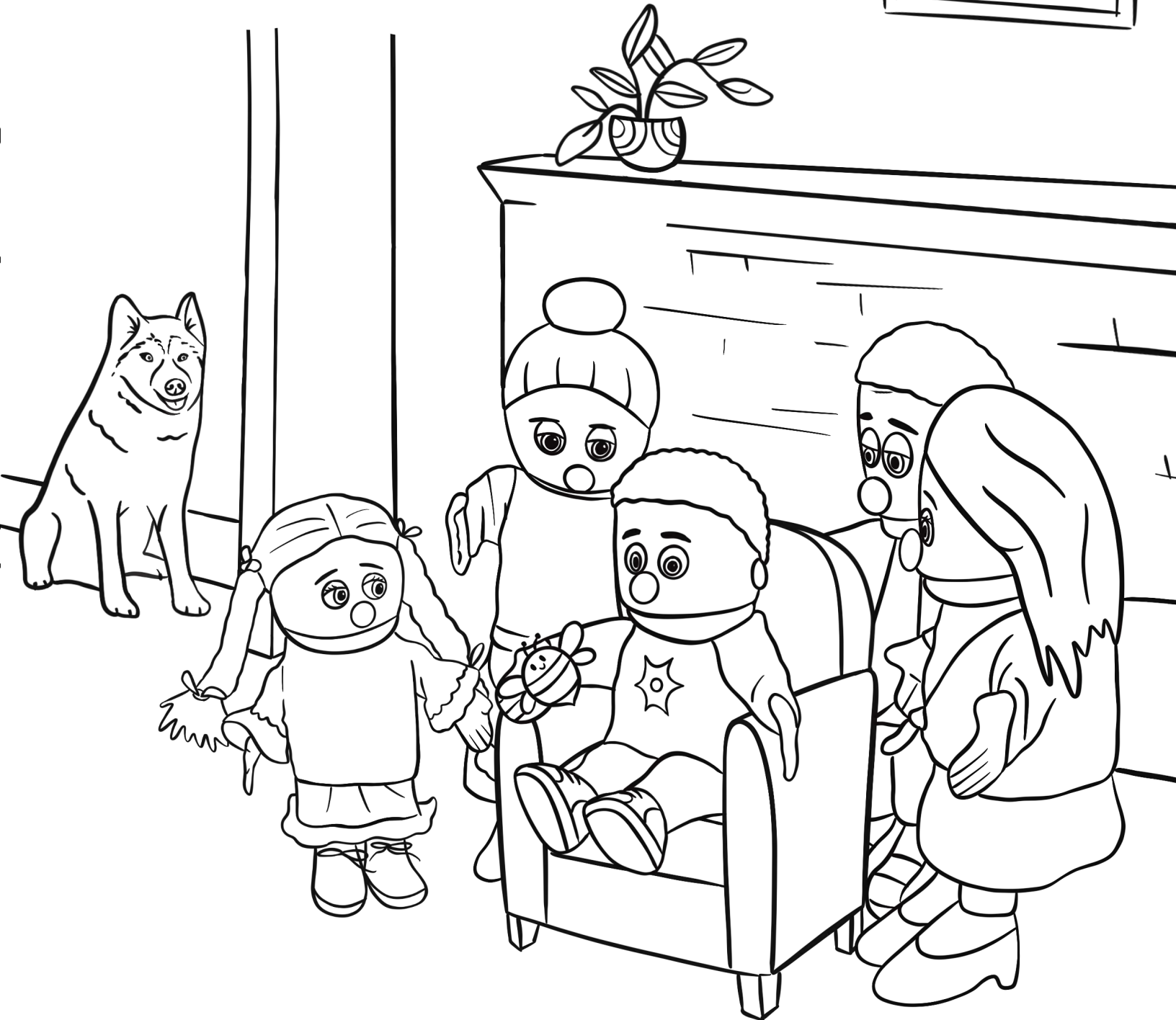
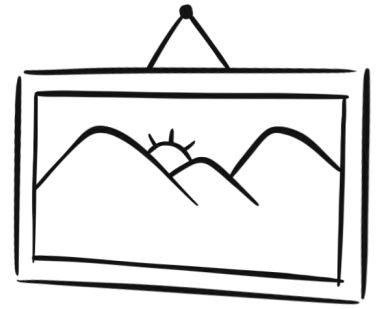


The pharmacist teaches him about the new allergy medicine in case he gets stung again.

Jade laughs and says, "And this bee will never sting you!"



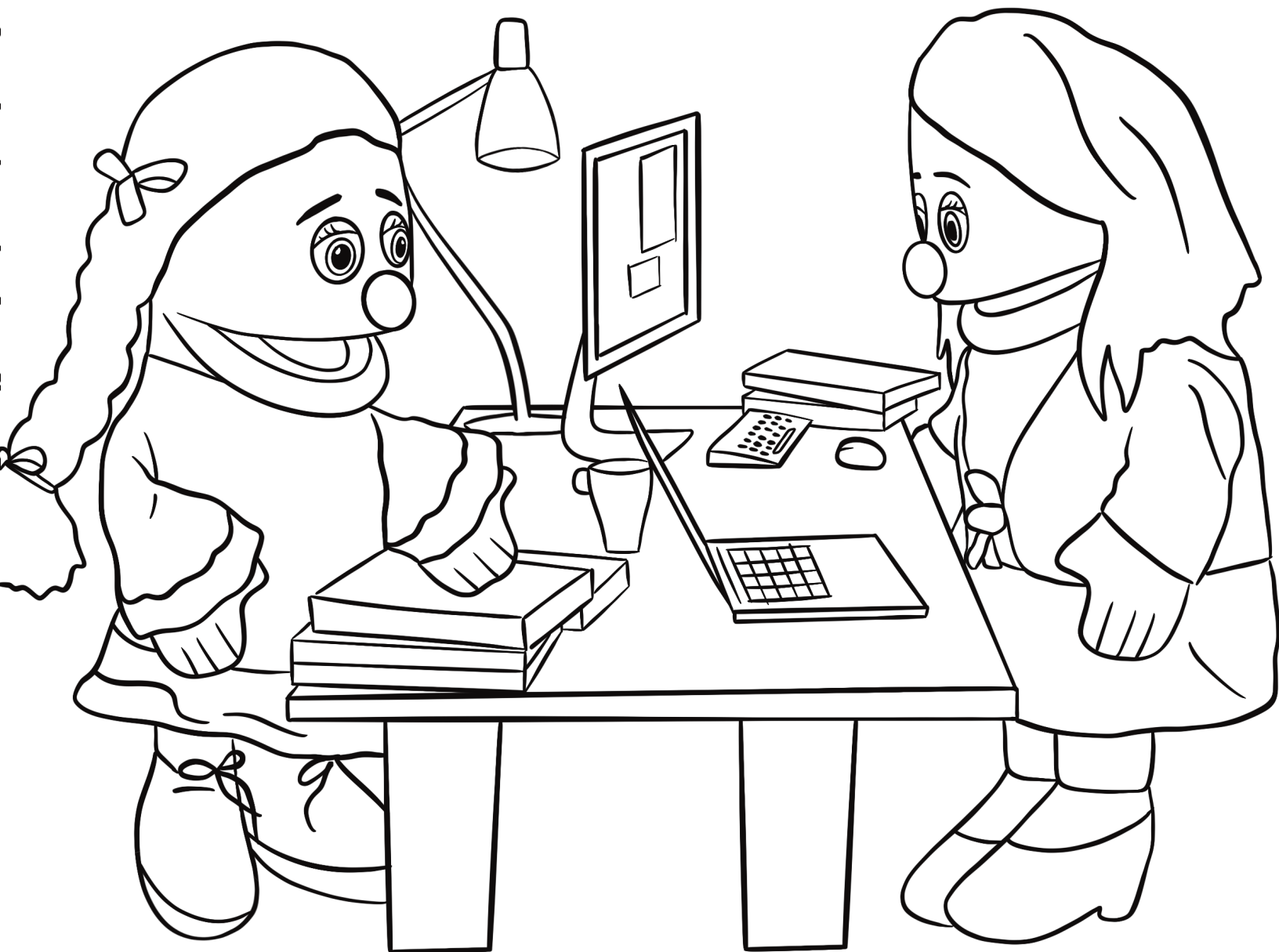
Dad says, "With everything going on, I never found out how you got stung."

James laughs and says, "Come here, Winston! You're in big trouble now."



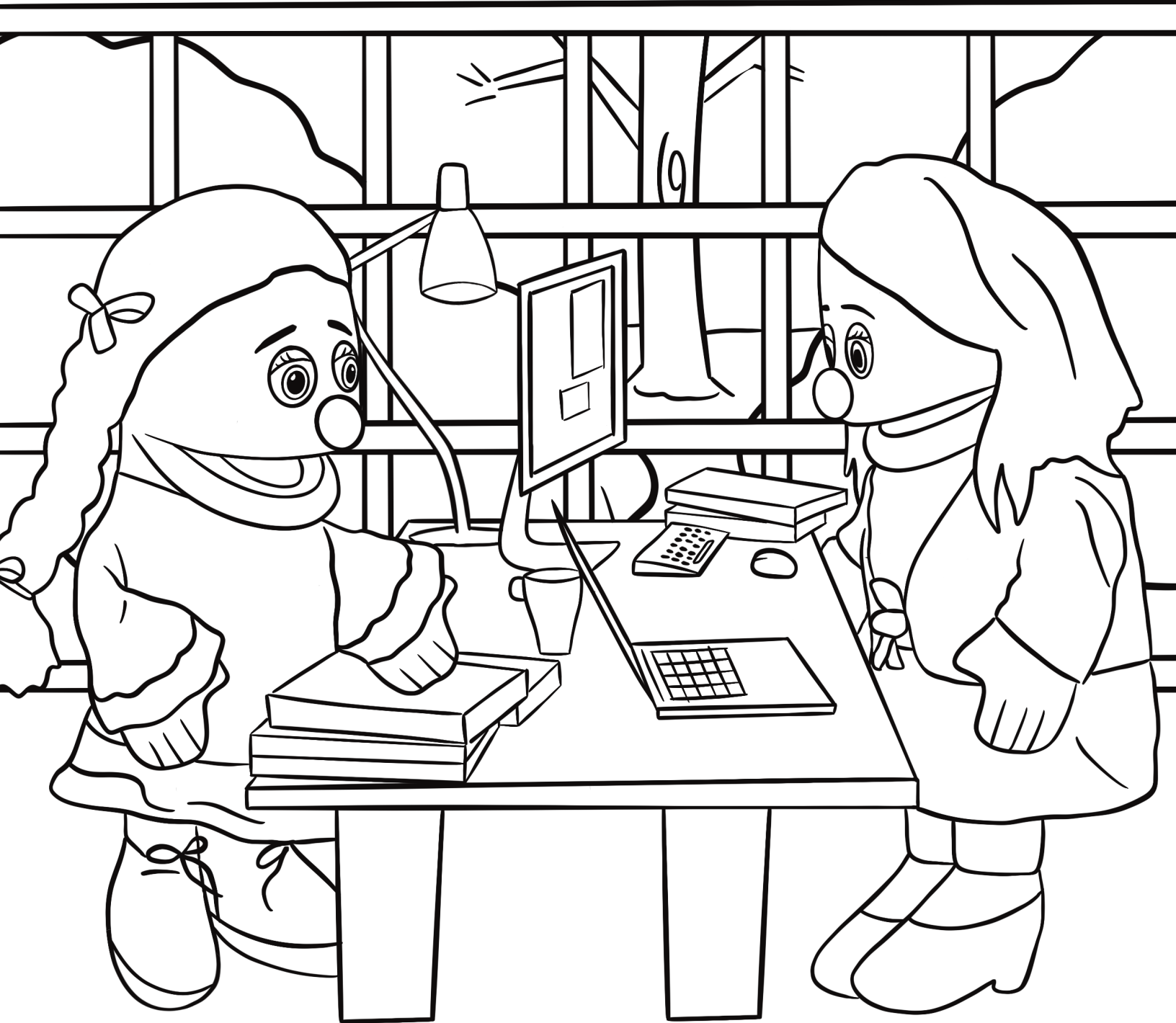

When Winston gets bored, watch out! He starts snooping and meddling and playing with anything he can find. Winston always takes things he shouldn't!

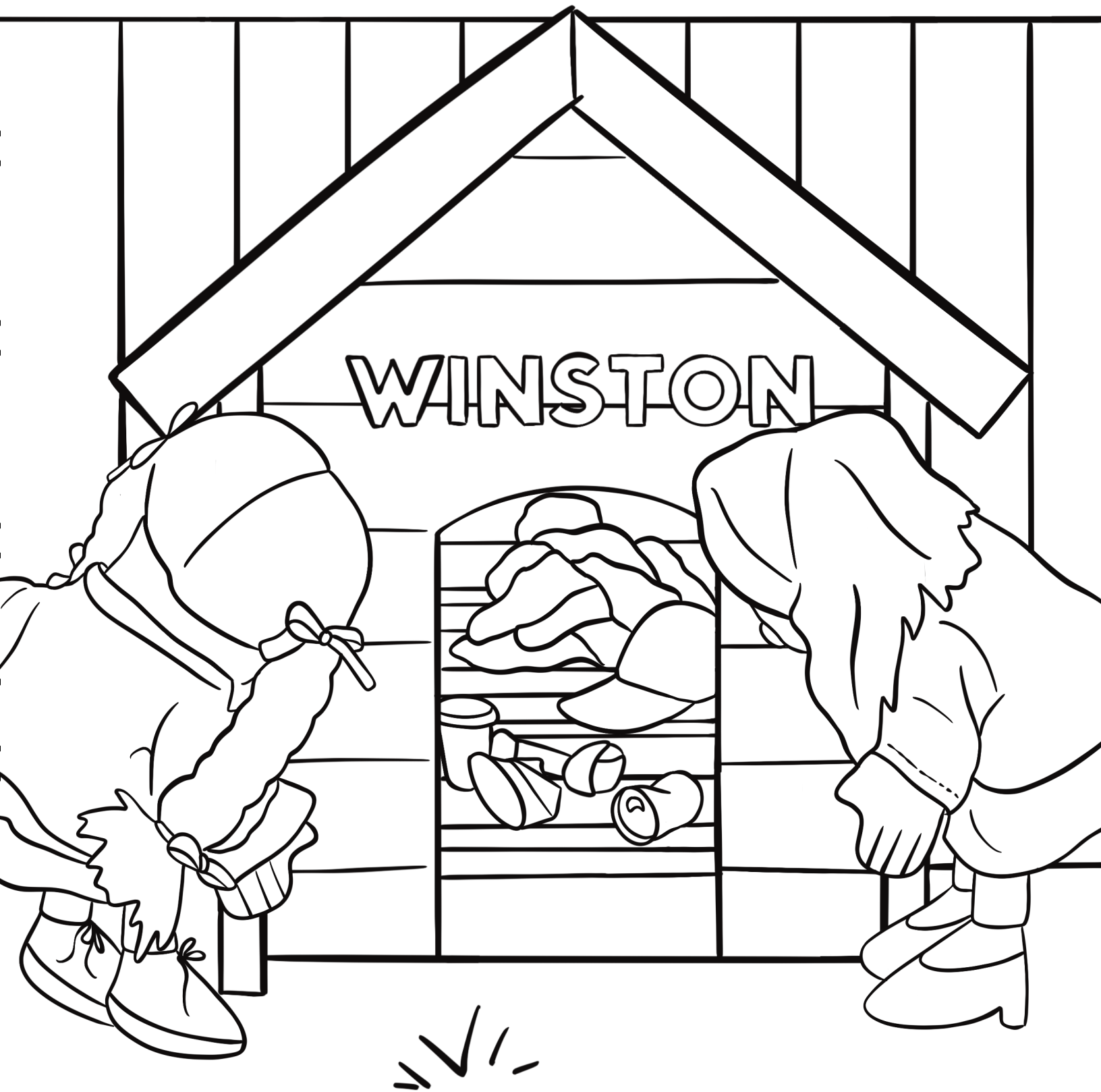


Mom is in her home office when Jade comes in and reminds Mom that she needs the doctor's health form for her class trip tomorrow.

Mom points to her desk and says, "It's right here."

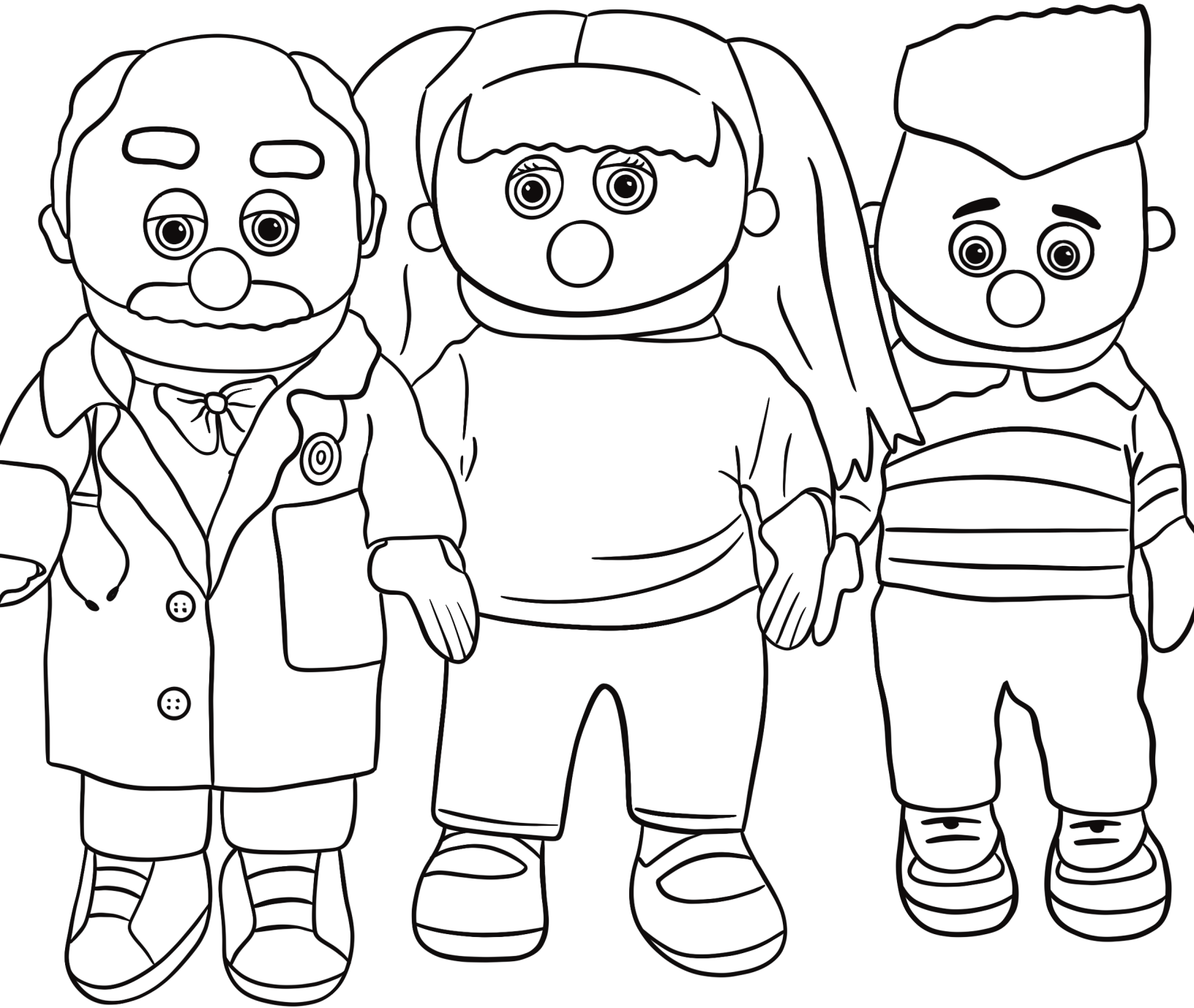
But then she sees it's not there ... OH NO!

- Checks kids who are going on class trips and signs their health forms.

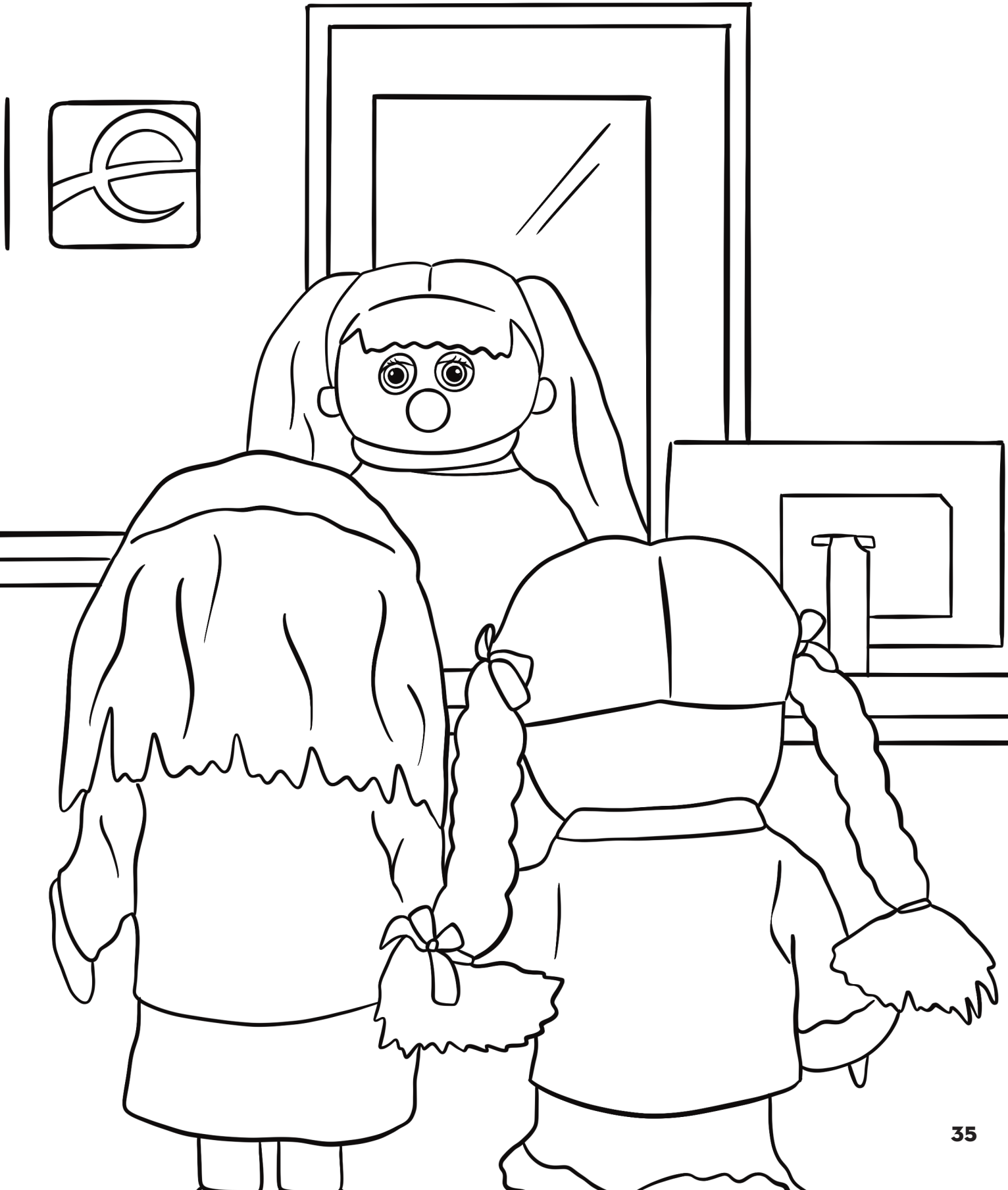
RECEPTIONIST

- Finds out what they need so they can talk to the right person.

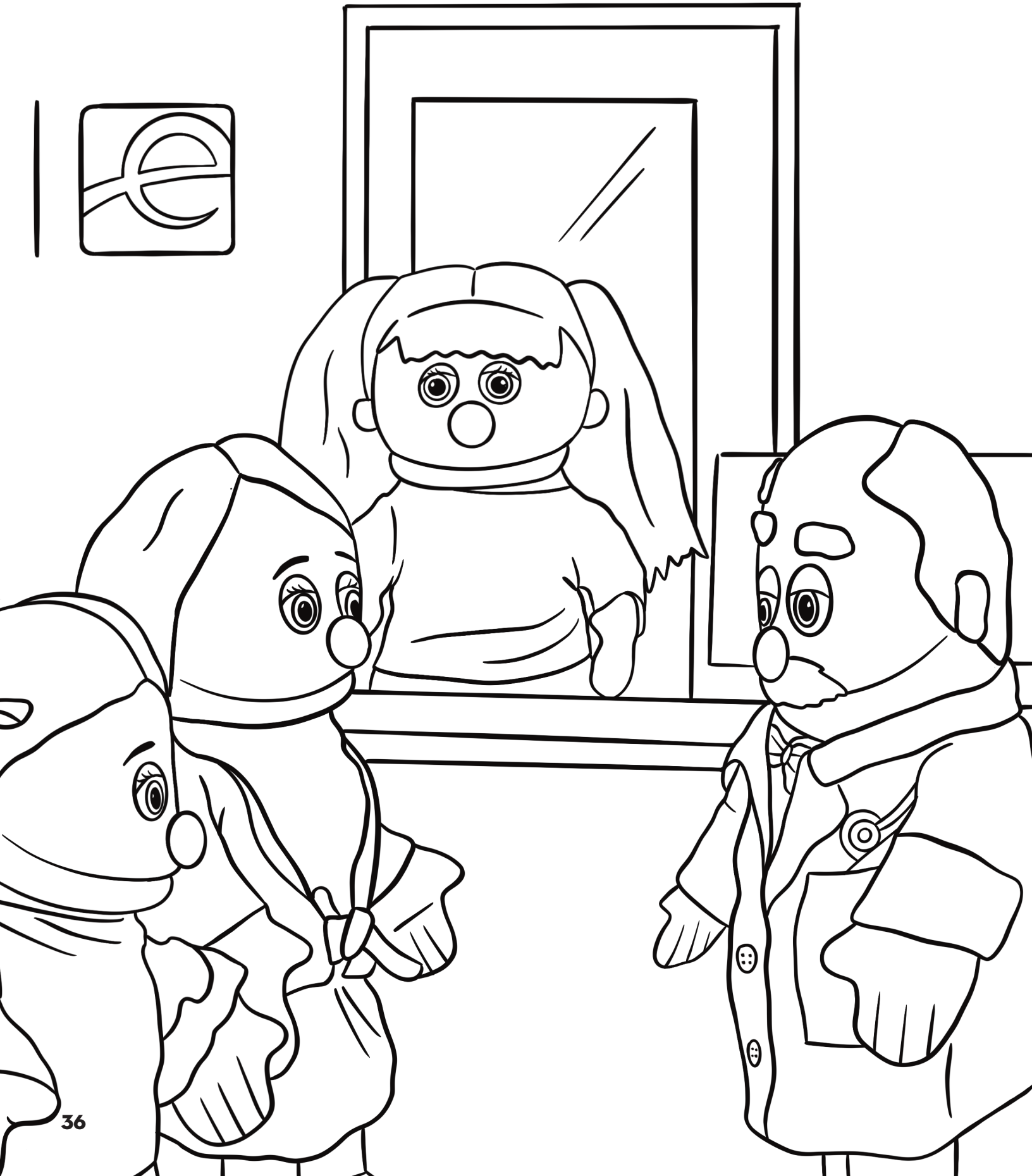
MEDICAL ASSISTANT

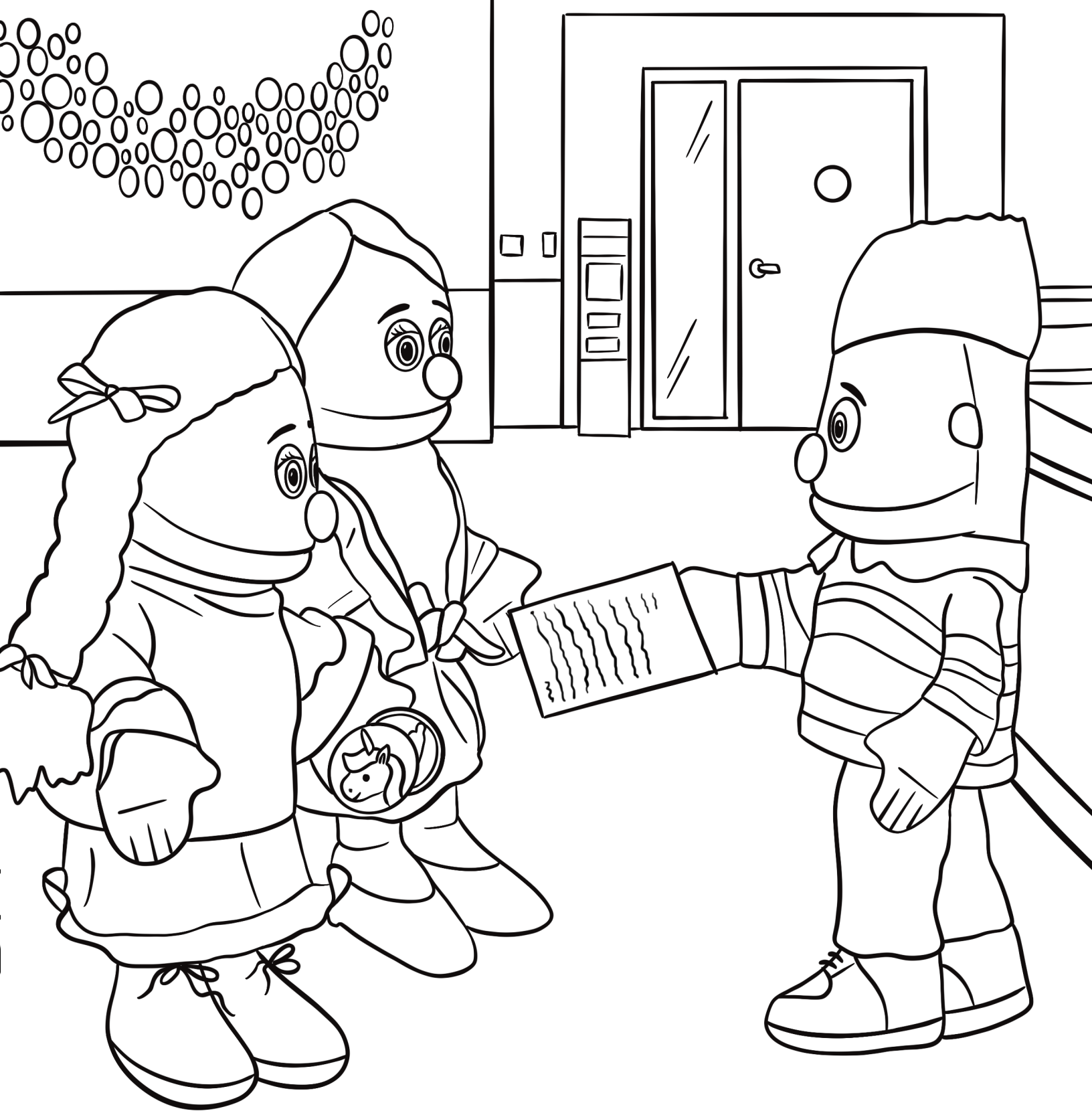
- Supports the doctor and staff.

The receptionist greets Jade and Mom and finds out what they need.



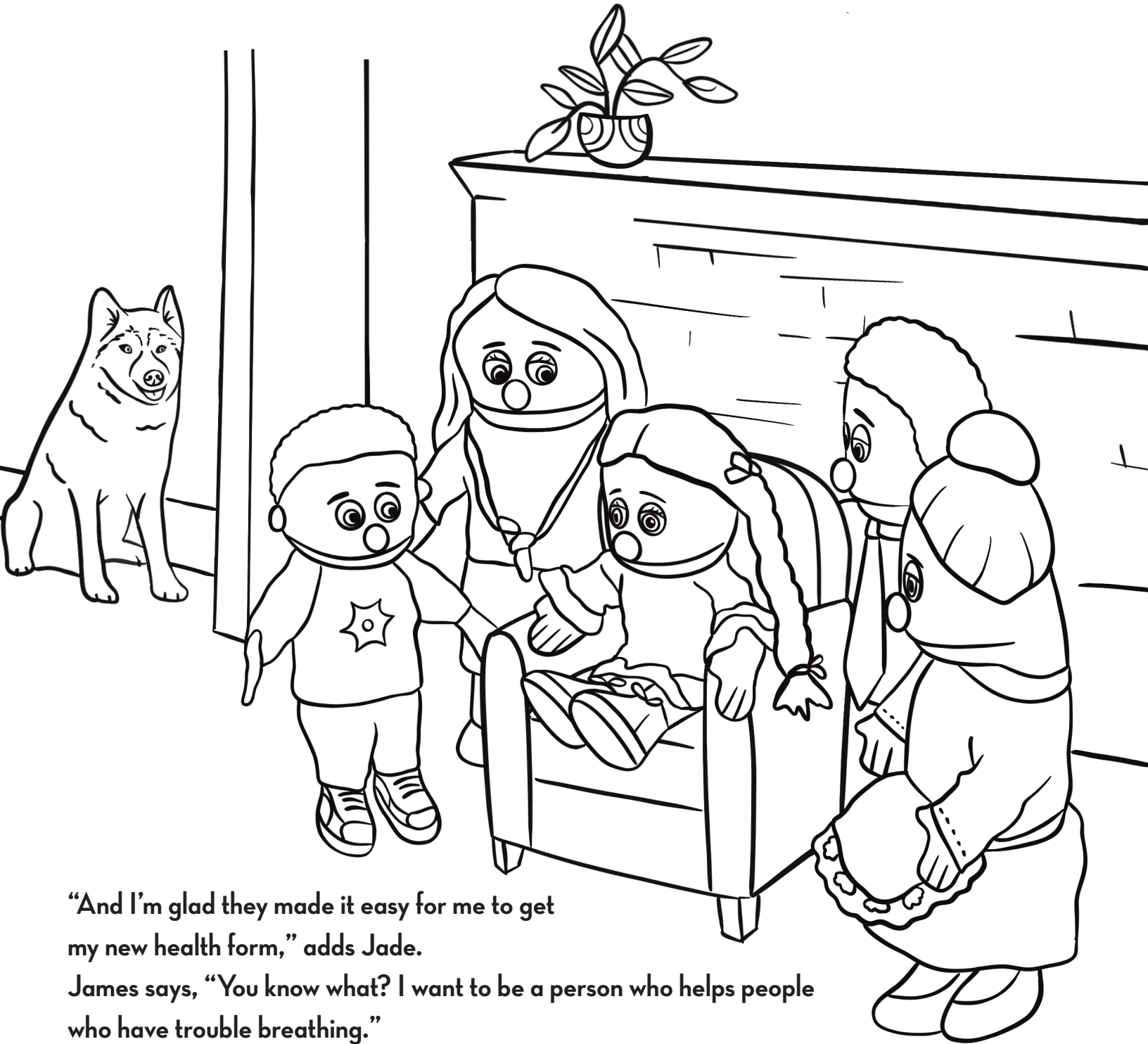
Then the pediatrician stops by to say hello and let them know she will sign a new form.

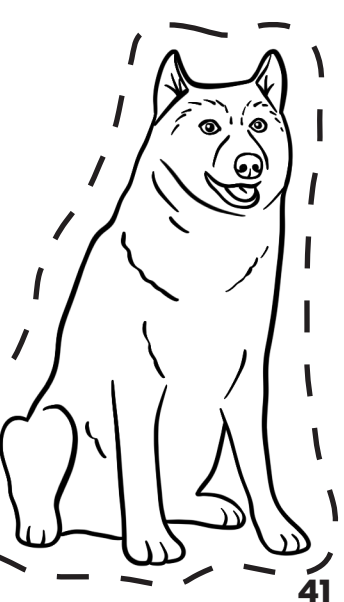
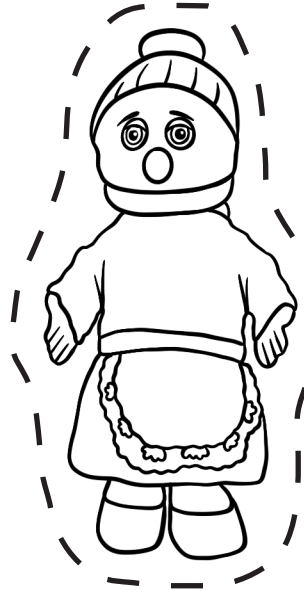
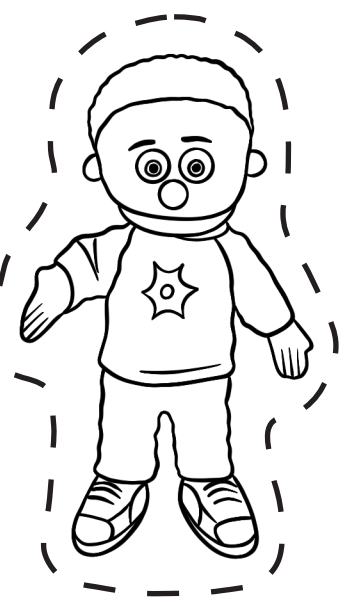
